


## Capacity Building

In 2021, we launched our Capacity Building Campaign. This is a twofold plan to renovate existing metal buildings on our property into conditioned spaces that can house our training facility and whelping rooms. The plan also includes launching our own breeding program. It is incredibly hard to find puppies from other organizations or breeders that meet our health and assessment criteria. We believe that in order to help more heroes in the future, that we need to have our own source of puppies. This will help increase the number of dogs that are consistently in training and reduce the number of dogs that we release from the program. Our goal for the Capacity Building Campaign is to raise \$270,000 in cash and donated equipment/services. As of 12/31/22, we raised \$112,000! We are so grateful to our supporters and look forward to closing out the campaign over the next 12 months. We are waiting on our permits to be approved by the County so that we can start some of the site prep like grading and installation of another septic system.

We are excited to report that Walker Valor has passed 3 out of 5 health clearances. She will be the first female in our breeding program. The final 2 clearances will be completed once she is a little older. She also completed GDBART testing at Warrior Canine Connection. This testing gives us a full picture of Walker's baseline behavior and temperament, which allows us to pair her with the most optimal breeding male. Walker should have her first litter of puppies in late 2023.

## 2022 Financials





#### **Expenses**

Program Service Expenses accounted for 73% of our total functional expenses, Management and General Expenses accounted for 20%, and Fundraising accounted for 7%. The two largest expense categories for 2022 were program staff payroll (\$79,787) and service dog costs such as food, veterinary care, travel and training supplies (\$33,792).

In the management and general expense category, our team expanded to include a Digital Marketing Spec. and Volunteer Coordinator, which will allow us to better advertise and recruit volunteers. We also expanded the Development Coordinator role into a Development and Operations role to include technology implementations and site management.

#### Revenue

In 2022, we raised over \$300,000. A portion of this, \$112,000, was for our Capacity Building Campaign, while the rest was for general program support. Thank you to our strong and loyal donor base for your support! When we compared donations to prior years, we were excited to learn that we had 150 brand new donors this year. We invest minimally into fundraising and we truly rely on grassroot efforts to spread the word about what we do. We appreciate everyone who shares our social media posts and monthly newsletter. We also have to thank our partner organizations and sponsors who support us and give us a platform to share our story.
